





# What do cemetery records provide?


- Dates


Transcribe the text from headstone images to turn them into Find A Grave Memorials!

## Billion Graves

- http://www.billiongraves.com
- Allows you to search for a headstone – globally
- Shooting for 1 billion grave records
- Search for a cemetery
- · Search within a cemetery
- Does require a login after a few searches

- Contribute
  - Take photos
  - Transcribe
  - Respond to photo requests from others
- Mobile App
  - IOS/Android

# Billion Graves (cont.)

- BG Plus
  - ~\$59.99/year
  - Virtual Walk-thru
    - Walk through the cemetery as if you were there
  - Map Your Ancestors
    - Map your search results across a globe
  - Record Notifications
    - Get notification of ancestors you're searching for
  - Ad Free
  - Priority Support

- Search for names globally
- Browse cemeteries
  - · Contains list of names in the cemeteries with birth and death date
  - Does not contain photos of headstones

# Names In Stone

  <a href="http://www.namesinst">one.com</a>
- Can search names globally
- Can search for a cemetery
- Dynamic cemetery maps – allows for easy review of whose buried next to your ancestor

# Names in Stone (cont.)

- Contribute
  - Volunteer opportunities
  - Mapping cemeteries
  - Transcribing headstones
  - Photograph headstones
- Membership Options
   Limited free searching, create
   your own map, track your research
   Standard Names In Stone keeps
   researching for you daily

# Visiting - Contact before you go

- Does the cemetery have a website?
- May need to schedule an appointment public vs. private cemeteries.
- See what the open hours are may not be open every day of the week
  - Gates open vs. office open
- · Information on where your ancestor might be buried
  - Unmarked graves
  - Buried grave markers
- · Details about your ancestor's burial
- Check cemetery guidelines & restrictions
  - · Rubbings, photographs, cleaning

# Visiting a cemetery – etiquette

- Be respectful other visitors may be there to mourn a loved one
- Be Safe snakes, gopher/rodent holes, sunken ground, overgrown shrubbery

# Visiting a cemetery

- Dress comfortably jacket, hat, check weather
- Pack accordingly
  - · Mirror, camera, fully charged phone
  - · Water, soft brush, scissors
  - Garden kneeling pad
