

## Palmyra Smith Homes

While at the Sacred Grove we visited the Welcome Center and with a missionary we toured both Smith homes: the log home and the frame home.

Moroni's visits took place at the frame house. Moroni was a messenger sent by Heavenly Father to Joseph Smith. He told Joseph that a book written

on gold plates was buried with the Urim and Thummin in a hill near Joseph's

birthplace. These plates were engraved with the Gospel and the history of the ancient people who

lived in that area. Joseph visited the hill three times that night and again the next day. It was interesting that all of Joseph's brothers

slept in the same room and didn't wake up with the light and talking going on.

## Grandin Press

Our next visit in Palmyra was to Grandin Press. The Book of Mormon was first printed and sold in the Grandin Building we saw in downtown Palmyra. After translating the golden plates, Joseph Smith agreed with Mr. Egbert B. Grandin to print five thousand copies of the Book of Mormon. Publication of the book was financed by Martin Harris, a family friend who mortgaged

part of his farm to guarantee the \$3,000 printing cost.

Mid-October, 1830, the prophet Joseph Smith and others gathered around Grandin's press to print

the first sheet. The work was "excellent," and printing of the book began. The Book of Mormon was first offered

for sale in Grandin's bookstore on March 26, 1830, as another witness of the divinity and mission of

Jesus Christ.

These plates contained the fulness of the Gospel and a history of the "quaint people" who lived on the American continent. Maria visited Joseph three times that night and again the next day. It was interesting that all of Joseph's brothers were in the same room and didn't wake up with the light and talking going on.

After examining the golden plates, Joseph Smith agreed with Mr. Egbert B. Grandin to print five thousand copies of the Book of Mormon. Publication of the book was financed by Martin Harris, a family friend who mortgaged part of his farm to guarantee the \$3,000 printing cost. In mid-August 1830 the Prophet, Joseph and several others gathered around Grandin's press to print and inspect a proof sheet. Joseph declared the work was "finished" and printing of the book began. The Book of Mormon was first offered for sale in Kirtland's Bookstore on March 24, 1830. It is another witness of the divinity and mission of Jesus Christ.

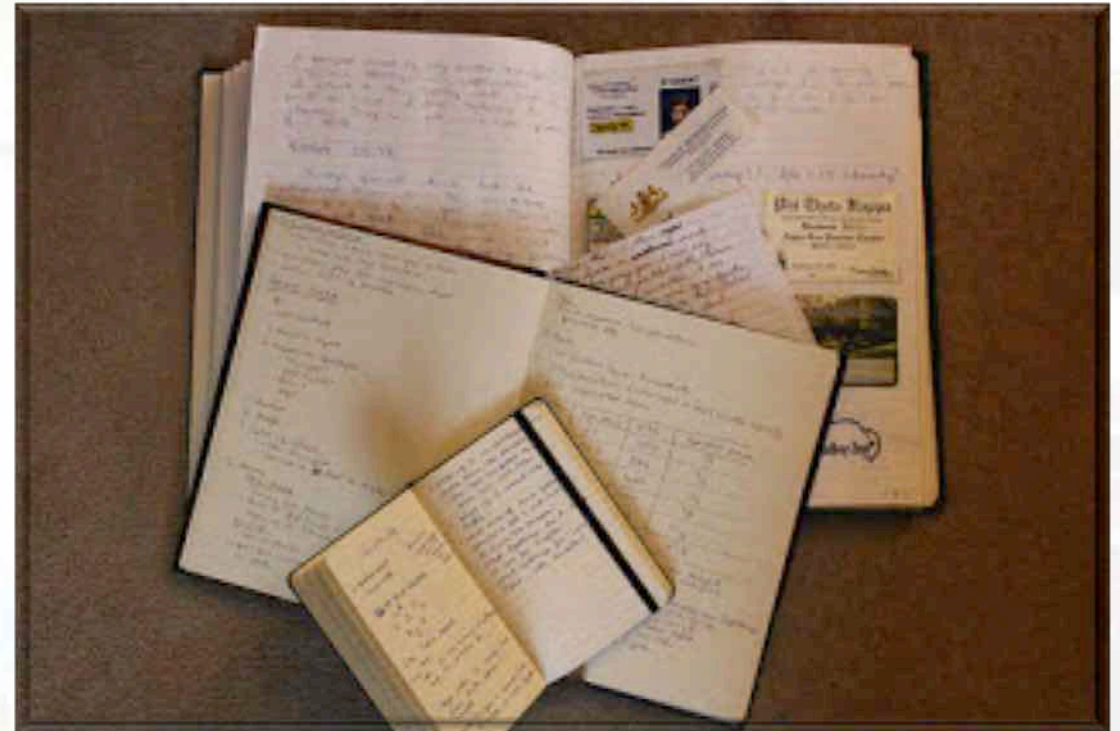


# Scrapbooks Through the Ages

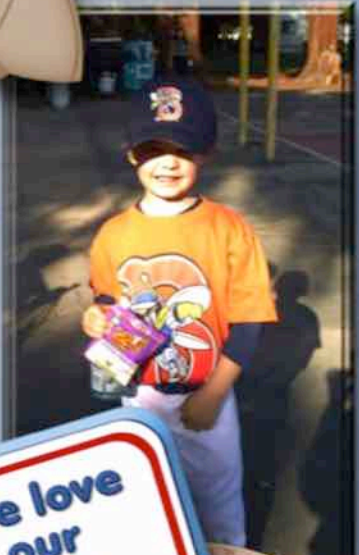

# Examples - Grandma's Cookbook

## Chicken Enchilada Quiche



### Ingredients:

- 1 Pillsbury® refrigerated pie crust
- 4 Eggs
- 1 Cup Half-and-Half or Milk
- 1-1/2 Cups Chunked Chicken Breast
- 1-1/2 Cups Broken Tortilla Chips
- 2 Cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese
- 1 Cup Shredded Cheddar Cheese

6. Bake 55 to 65 minutes until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Serve with sour cream/salsa.

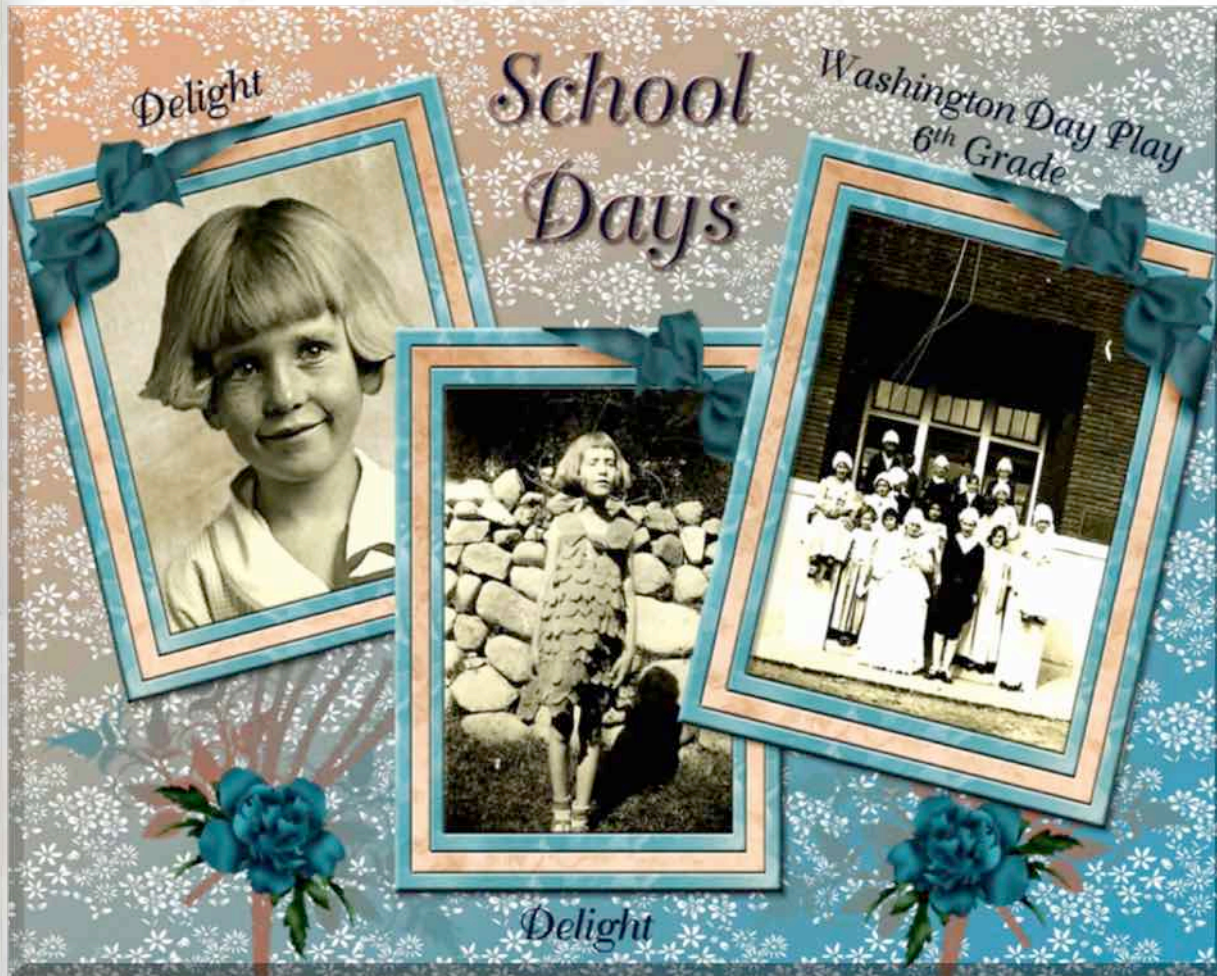

In his book "The Life of Heber C. Kimball," Orson F. Whitney entitles Chapter 6 "The Gathering of the Titans," in describing Heber C. Kimball and Brigham Young meeting Joseph Smith in Kirtland. The experience strengthened their families and contributed in an important way to preparing their sons of destiny for what was to come.

If we get to spend our whole mission with them, what a blessing and a learning experience it will be.



Stephen and Charlotte served the custard hot over an apple and strawberry pie. It was really GOOD! It would be great over any kind of crumble or crisp. Stephen sent the remainder of the custard home with us. We were happy to take it. Walt agreed it was the best he had tasted.

September Week 3: This week was spent primarily working toward our monthly goal of getting to all the members (active and less-active) in the Weymouth Branch. However, on Saturday we went to the First Annual Weymouth Victorian Military Tattoo. For some unfathomable reason I have this very positive idea that I have already written about this subject. I know I have researched "Tattoo", but I can't find a write up anywhere. Oh well, very senior moment.

The Weymouth Victorian Military Tattoo is billed as "a full living history event including the Garrisoning of one of Britain's finest Victorian Fortresses." The five Regiments: (1) The Green Howards; (2) The 24th Foot of Zulu War; (3) The Middlesex Regiment - Diehard Company; (4) the 11th Hussars; and (5) The Royal Artillery who were stationed inside the Fort since they were hosting the Garrison. 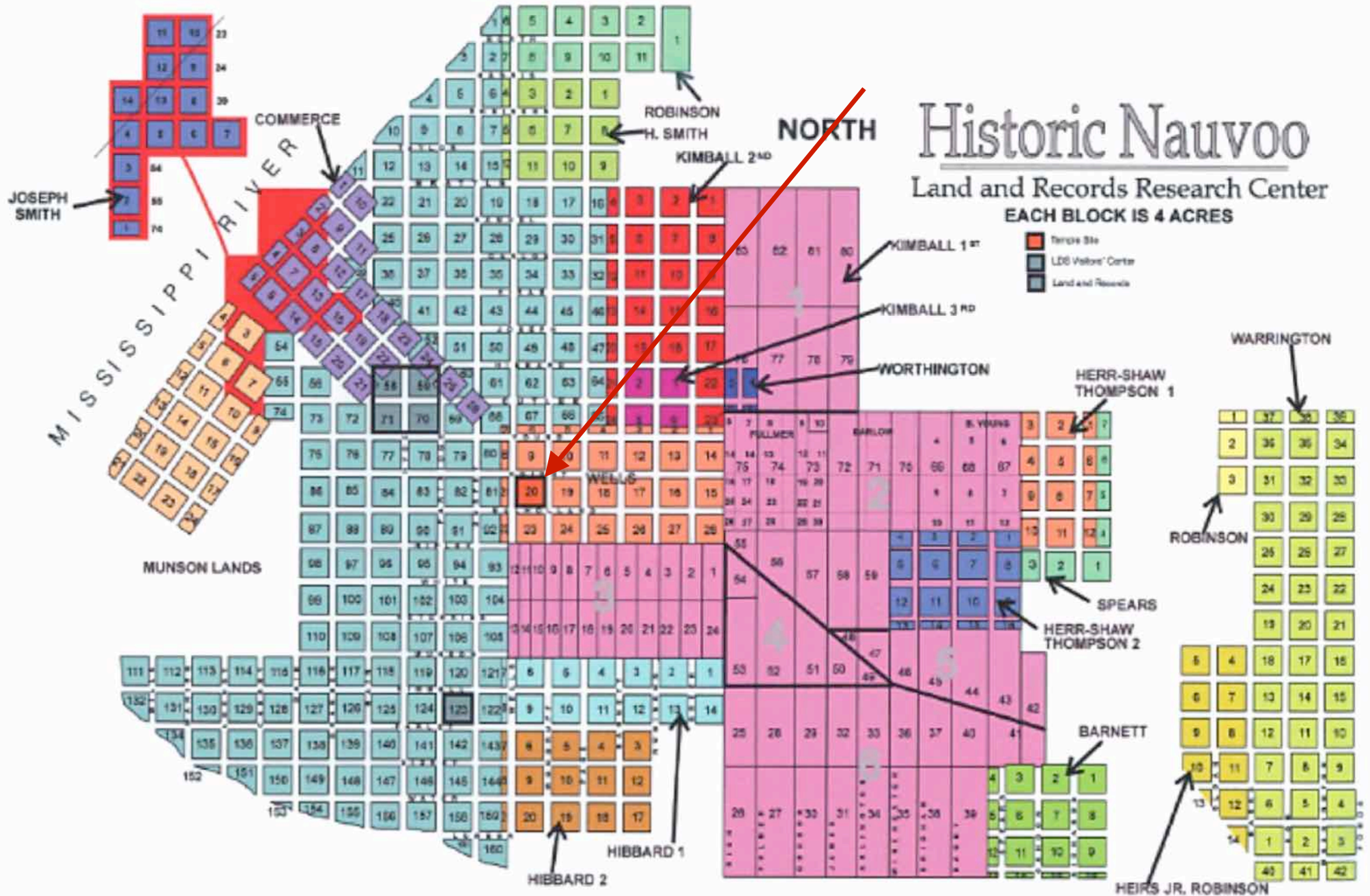

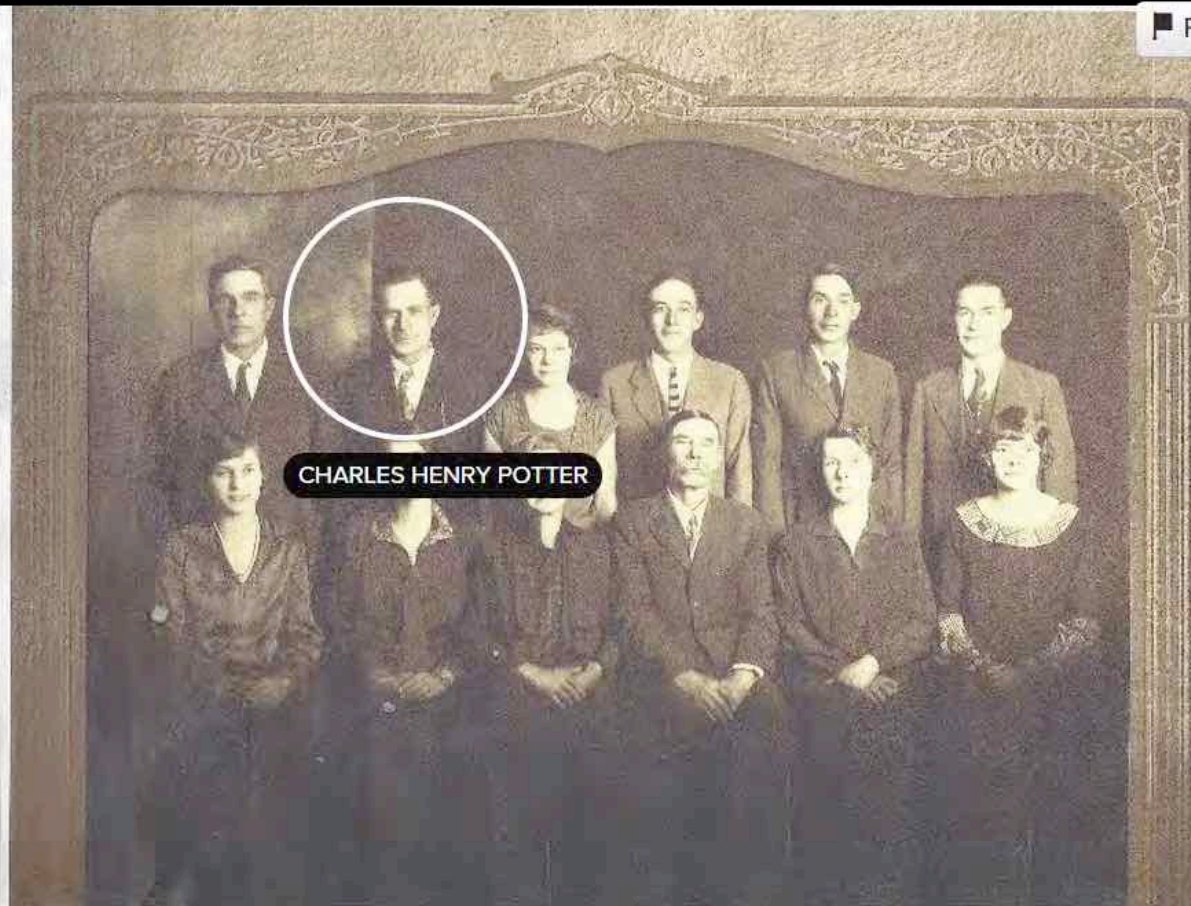

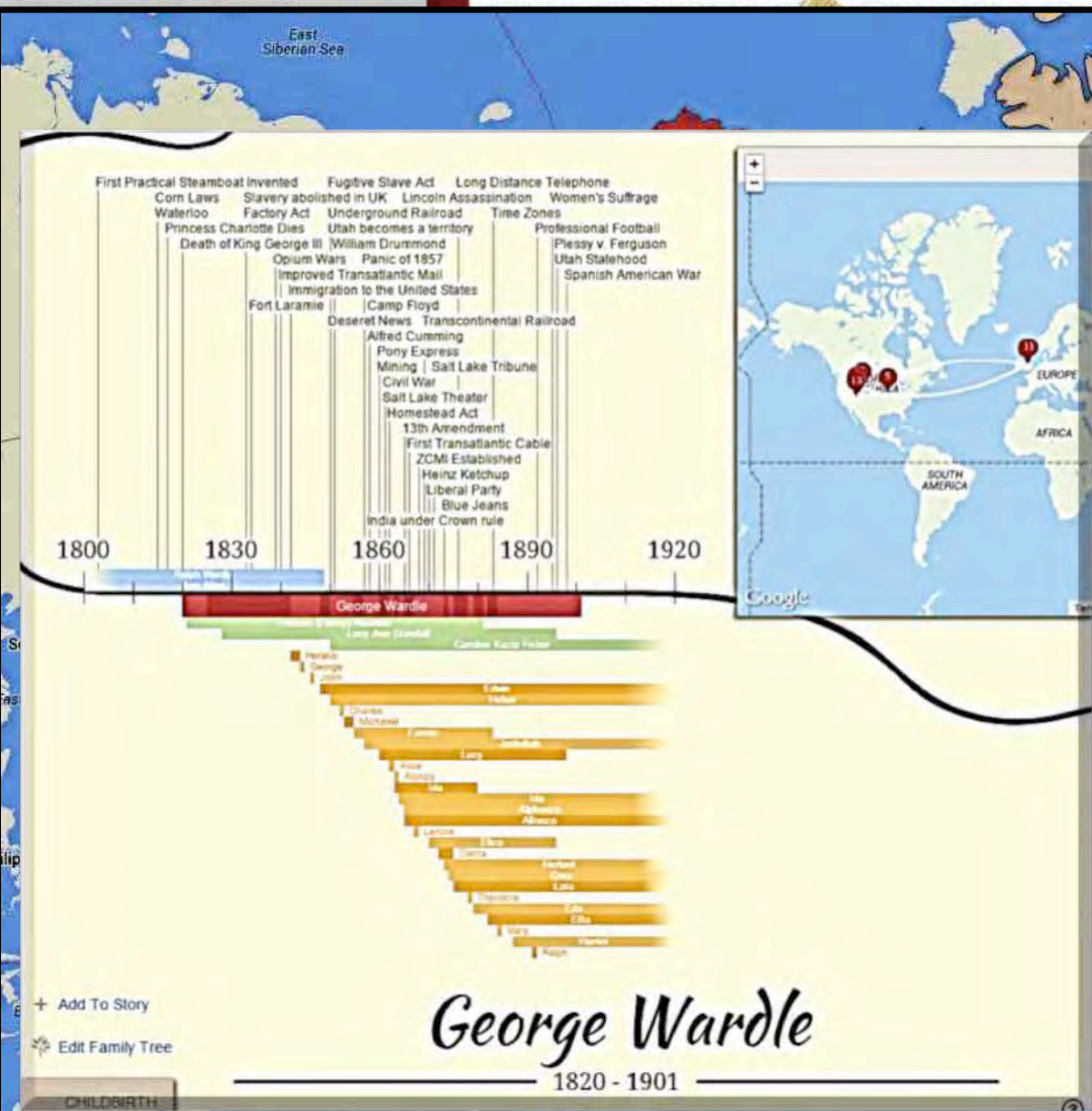

George was born on 3 February 1820, in Cheddleton, Staffordshire, England, United Kingdom. His mother was Ann Allen and was 31 years old when George was born. His father was Ralph Wardle and was 45 years old at the time. George was the sixth of eight children. His older siblings, Ralph, Michael, Olive, John, and Alice, were 11, 10, 8, 5, and 4 years old when he was born.

England, 1820

During the 1800s, England experienced growing pains brought on by rapid population expansion. In 1800, 75% of England's population lived in the countryside, but by 1900, that same percentage had moved into towns. Urban centers like London flooded with poor men and women looking to make a living, although unsanitary and harsh conditions constrained the benefits of living and working in the city. New technologies brought on by the Industrial Revolution popularized manufacturing jobs, but they paid little.

Childbirth

George's mother assumed significant risks when she gave birth to him. During this period, the average British mother had an average of six children over her lifetime. And while some families could afford doctors or even a trip to a hospital, most births still occurred in the home, with midwives--or sometimes just other family members--assisting in the birthing process. Because of this, poor hygiene and sanitation could pose serious problems. Even as medical developments like forceps, chloroform as anesthesia, and laceration repair made childbirth safer than in decades past, a significant amount of infants still died from preventable sicknesses.

George's future wife, Frances, was born 1 year after George. Frances was born in Leek, Staffordshire, England, United Kingdom.

## Potter's Point

"On the east shoreline of Echo Reservoir. This the area where Isaac S. Potter was buried after his murder on August 1, 1867. The story goes that the town of Coalville, Utah would not allow him to be buried in the city cemetery so he was buried here at the mouth of Grass Creek Canyon, which can be seen extending into the mountains to the right of Potter's Point. It was said that his Indian friends watched over his grave. Recently, in a low water year, bones were found exposed in the reservoir bed near this point.

Subsequently, they were accepted as Isaac's remains and they were re-interred in the Provo City Cemetery, Provo, Utah (Potter Genealogy).



## Who was Isaac Smith Potter?

There are well known stories regarding Isaac (or Ike as he was apparently known) and, depending on the viewpoint of the author, the stories differ: some view him as a cattle thief and criminal, some as a possible apostate, some as a possible government (US) agent, and some as an individual who may have been, at least partially, wronged by others. But, the general outline of what happened remains the same.

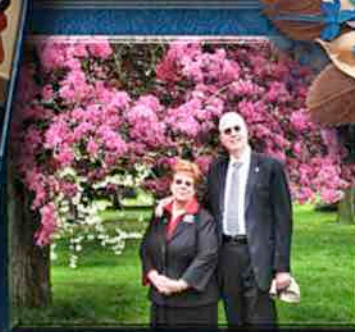

# Our Mission



We reported to the MTC (Missionary Training Center) on the first of December spend 23 months in the England London South Mission. After a frustrating wait at Gatwick, the Assistants to the President (APs) met us and took us to the Mission Office at the London Temple. We spent three days there before leaving for Weymouth (a beautiful little seaside town in the south west of England). Our Elders met us at the house (right, semi-detached and 550 square feet) and took us to the High Street to get sheets and a comforter for the beds, etc., so we could have a place to sleep for the night. That evening we went to the Weymouth Branch Christmas Party, met most everybody in the branch, and had a really good time.



Looking at the Mission map, you can see us down in Weymouth (red). You can also see how very large the Poole Zone really is. We also helped out in Salisbury (blue).

The Saints in this area are lovely, humble people. Sunday, 21 December 2008, I wrote in my journal: "Today was our first Sacrament Meeting at the Weymouth Branch. It was just like being at home. Everybody was friendly and, after Friday's party, we didn't feel at all like strangers." Brother Hutchins, the Branch Mission Leader quoted: "Ephesians 2:19—Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God." That's just how we felt - no far away and yet so familiar and loved.

We were so blessed with the Elders that served with us in our area and district. We came to love each and every one of them. They all knew if they were anywhere close to our house and needed to use the bathroom or take a break, they could call (and if we were home), I would serve them cookies and milk. We had them to dinner most every week and I just loved to feed them. The picture at the bottom was taken during lunch at Hyde Park Chapel when all the missionaries were invited to meet with President Uchtdorf. These were most of the missionaries we served with (a great group of young men). What a marvelous day! We had some "self" time and took in the Natural History and the Victoria and Albert Museums. Then the two-hour meeting with President and Sister Uchtdorf was wonderful.

As we came to the end of our mission, we were of divided minds. We were excited to go home and see everyone we had left behind; however, we hated to leave the wonderful Saints we had learned to love as we served.

### Five Valuable Lessons Learned on Our Mission

1. Don't leave the house before you pray for specific blessings.
2. Expect the Spirit to speak.
3. Keep working and don't stop; never give up on any one.
4. Know and love the people you serve.
5. Material things you don't need when you are anxiously engaged in good works.
6. Bring cookies.

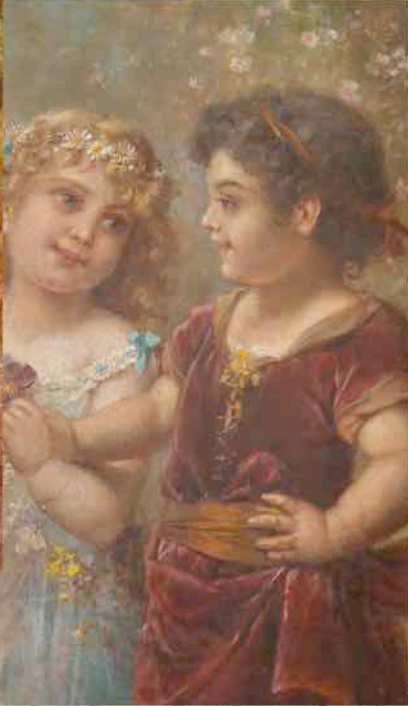

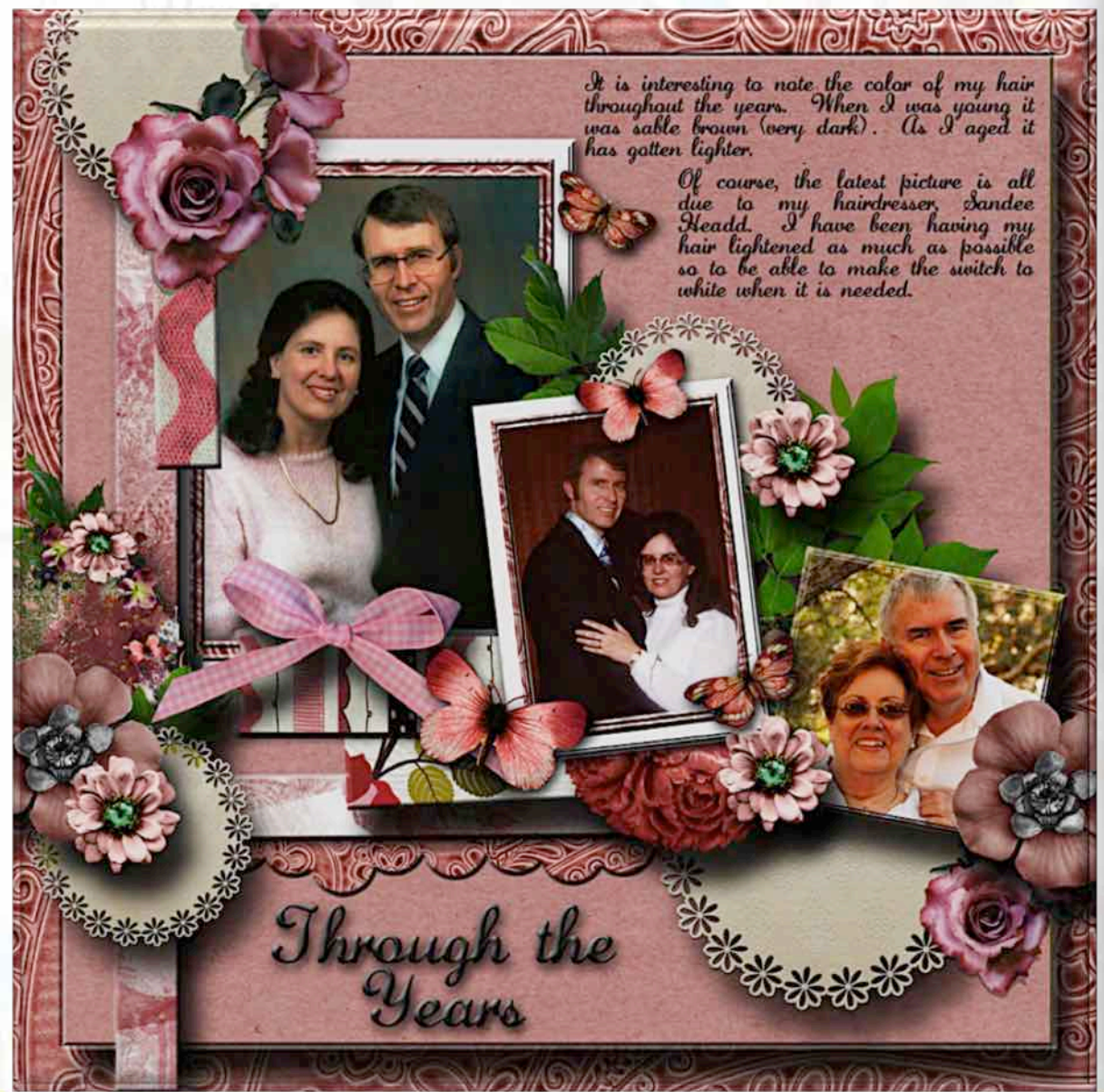

George Wardle was one of the first men to look down into the Valley of the Great Salt Lake on the morning of the 21st of July, 1847 after that memorable trek across the plains. He was a native of England where he was born in Leek, Staffordshire county, February 3, 1820, and was also baptized a member of the Mormon Church in that country by Elder George A. Smith. In 1842 he sailed for America to join with the body of the Church in Nauvoo, Illinois, bringing with him his wife of two weeks, Fannie Rushton. He immediately engaged in his trade of wheelwright having learned how to do this work in his father's shop in England. His services were in great demand and he was busily engaged in repairing wagons when anti-Mormon mobs drove the Saints from that city. At Winter Quarters he was selected to go with the pioneer group.

Arriving in the Valley he performed whatever labors were asked of him until the time of his return to the states for his wife. He had been an ardent student of music in England and Brigham Young learning of his talents along that line, asked him, on his arrival in the valley the second time, to teach a class in dancing. He started his dancing school in Marcy Thompson's log house while a hall was being built. Among his students were President Brigham Young, George Q. Cannon, George A. Smith and other leading brethren of the Church. He also helped to organize the first choir and the first brass band in Salt Lake City.

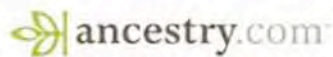

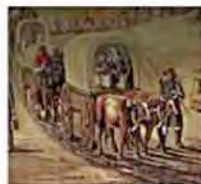

In several respects Box Elder County has presented a very peculiar historical cast and record. Here grew up as the capital of the county the only incorporated communistic city of the age, whose unique history we shall presently review; here, also, flourished for a while the only "Gentile City" of modern times.

The *Utah Directory* gives the following brief sketch:

"This is one of the largest of the northern counties. It is bounded on the east by Cache County, on the west by the state of Nevada, on the north by Idaho Territory, and on the south by Weber County, the Great Salt Lake and Tooele County. The Central Pacific Railroad enters Box Elder County at the Hot Springs, a few miles north of Ogden, and runs westward along the lake shore to Nevada. At the same point the Utah and Northern Railway diverges to the northward, passing through the county on its way to Cache. A large district in the south-western portion of the county is rendered a blank by the Great American Desert, but to the north-west the range is excellent, and in the mountainous districts are some valuable mines and fine timber. The mineral resources have not been largely developed, but there are indications of silver, lead, copper, iron, and even coal that may prove valuable on more complete investigation. The portion of the county which has the largest population, and which is being fully developed in its agricultural features, is the region basing the Wasatch. Here a number of thriving settlements give a large yield of the fruits of the earth, grain and other cereals being raised with remarkable success. Experiments have proven the soil to be suitable for every variety of small grain, and no other county has paid so much attention to the raising of rye, buckwheat, flax, etc. The county seat is Brigham City."

## Palmyra Smith Homes

While at the Sacred Grove we visited the Welcome Center and with a missionary we toured both Smith homes: the log home and the frame home.

Moroni's visits took place at the frame house. Moroni was a messenger sent by Heavenly Father to Joseph Smith. He told Joseph that a book written on gold plates was buried with the Urim and Thummim in a hill near Joseph's home. These plates contained the fullness of the Gospel and a history of the ancient people who lived on the American continent. Moroni visited Joseph three times that night and again the next day. It was interesting that all of Joseph's brothers slept in the same room and didn't wake up with the light and talking going on.

## Grandin Press

Our next visit in Palmyra was to Grandin Press. The Book of Mormon was first printed and sold in the Grandin Building we saw in downtown Palmyra. After translating the golden plates, Joseph Smith agreed with Mr. Egbert B. Grandin to print five thousand copies of the Book of Mormon. Publication of the book was financed by Martin Harris, a family friend who mortgaged part of his farm to guarantee the \$3,000 printing cost.

In mid-August 1829, the Prophet Joseph and several others gathered around Grandin's press to print and inspect a proof sheet. Joseph declared the work was "excellent," and printing of the book began. The Book of Mormon was first offered for sale in Grandin's bookstore on March 26, 1830, as another witness of the divinity and mission of Jesus Christ.
