Legacy Family Tree is offering a choice of five languages in the latest version of the program. The new languages are Dutch, Bokmål (Norwegian) and Norsk (Norwegian) in addition to English and Danish available in earlier versions. Work is underway at Millenia Corporation to eventually offer Afrikaans, German, Estonian, Spanish, French, Italian, Português (Brazil), Finnish, and Swedish. ## Of Interest

### FamilySearch Issues RFI

FamilySearch is a nonprofit educational institution established by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints for the promotion and preservation and sharing of genealogical information throughout the world. FamilySearch recently extended an offer to organizations holding records collections to digitize, index, publish, and preserve their collections free of charge. The RFI (Request for Information) includes a long list of types of records of interest. Some well-known service providers such as Footnote.com, Ancestry.com, the New England Historic Genealogical Society (a nonprofit service provider), FindMyPast.com have already signed up for partnerships.

As a partner, FamilySearch deliver images of original records at no cost to service providers. The records must be published online according to guidelines specified in the RFI. The most significant requirement is that records published under this project are to be available at no charge to patrons at the Family History Library in Salt Lake City and at local FamilySearch Family History Centers around the world. Other requirements are that the information also must be available to members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at no charge and that an index can be available at [www.FamilySearch.org](http://www.FamilySearch.org). For these requirements, the organization receives the digitized records and index which they may put online or on

computers within their archive. They are free to charge reasonable fees for access to the information. This will give genealogists a choice of traveling to a Family History Center to have free access or quickly getting the information online for a modest fee. •
