Genealogy Sitebuilding version 7.0

The *Next Generation of Genealogy Sitebuilding* is a genealogy program that runs on a Web server. TNG works like any other genealogy program. It has most all the features one expects in a modern genealogy program. Users can build a large genealogy database, edit the data, generate charts and timelines and more. TNG is installed on a Windows, UNIX, Apple or Linux web server and is used online. It can operate as a multi-user program. Scattered users can access the database and even add new data simultaneously.

The program author, Darrin Lythgoe, has added more than 100 changes to the program. A full list of the changes is found at <http://lythgoes.net/genealogy/rec entchanges.php>. Current users of version 5 or version 6 may upgrade to version 7 for \$12.99. Otherwise, version 7 of the *Next Generation of Genealogy Sitebuilding* costs \$29.99. Scotland Online Expands

Scotland Online is an Internet company that owns the Scotlandspeople.gov.uk Web site. That site has vital records and other data under a license from the General Register Office for Scotland (GROS), the

National Archives of Scotland and the official heraldic authority, the Court of the Lord Lyon. Earlier this year, Brightsolid, the parent company of Scotland Online purchased a competitor: Findmypast.com. Both websites charge people to search census and other data. Findmypast.com. Charges vary from £6.95 for 60 search credits to £89.95 for a 12-month subscription. Currently, Brightsolid is the only company that charges customers for GROS data. This status may change and put the brakes on expansion plans at Scotland Online.

A Scottish government spokesman said that data the company received under license from GROS will soon be advertised to others for a nominal administrative fee. Van der Kuyl, recently appointed chief executive of Brightsolid, stated that he is aware the government was in negotiations to offer licences to other companies but he considered it "not a threat but an opportunity." The company plans to purchase several of the licences for Findmypast.com, which is currently not licensed to use GROS data. Brightsolid has about two million registered users for their genealogy Web sites. They also see potential growth for their genealogy Web sites and hope to acquire more data to offer their customers.

Brightsolid was recently awarded a contract to digitize, license and publish the 1911 Census of England and Wales from the National Archives in Kew, London. Van der Kuyl said the contract win is important because the 1911 data is the most recent data available by license. There is a 100-year bar on publishing the census data. Van der Kuyl also stated that the

contract demonstrates the company's ambitions to expand in markets outside Scotland.

Chis van der Kuyl has been widely known for his role in the computer games industry. In 1999, he addressed the Labor Party Conference while only in his twenties, and claimed that he would build his game development firm, VIS Entertainment, into a £500 million empire in three years. He eventually sold the business to American games publisher BAM! for £4.5m in 2004. Time will tell us whether he can meet his expectations for success as the leader of an Internet genealogy company.
