The Thomas Jefferson Foundation

The Thomas Jefferson Foundation has a Web site that provides information about the life and times of Thomas Jefferson. The foundation was organized in 1923 to own and operate Monticello, the home of Thomas Jefferson. Since 1923, the foundation has expanded to become a museum and educational institution. The foundation Web site, www.Monticello.org, is a major source of information about Jefferson and Monticello. The site has several databases with information of interest to

genealogists, particularly those working on African-American family history.

The first database of interest is the Monticello Plantation Database with information about more than six hundred slaves who lived on Thomas Jefferson's Virginia plantations between 1774 and 1826. The site has short biographies of individuals and accounts of various aspects of slavery at Monticello. The data at the site includes details of life span, family structure, occupations, and details of the purchase, sale, and other actions regarding ownership of the slaves. The Getting Word Web site (at <http://www.monticello.org/gettingword/>) is about a project begun in 1993 to interview the descendants of Monticello's African-American families. The site now has more than seventy pages of biographical information gathered from historical records and interviews with more than 170 individuals. Many photographs are included with the biographies.

A third Web page sponsored by the Thomas Jefferson Foundation is the Monticello Classroom (at

<http://classroom.monticello.org/>).

It is a site for teachers and students of elementary and secondary schools, where they can find information about Thomas Jefferson and life at Monticello. For someone who has never been to Monticello, it is good way to see Jefferson's home.
